BLLENHEIM, NEW ZEALAND

7.3%

Inspired by insanely-flavourful US West Coast pale ales, Hopwired is a celebration of what New Zealand hops can do, made with only locally-developed varieties (Nelson Sauvin, Motueka and Pacific Jade). Little wonder that 8 Wired recently won top honours at the Beer Awards.

Bulmers Cider

Small \$7.5 | Large \$9

GISBORNE, NEW ZEALAND

4.6%

Bulmers has been making cider for over 120 years and is now being produced under licence here, in sunny Gisborne. It has a reddish tinge in the glass, is full-bodied and sits at the slightly sweeter end of the scale.

Coopers Pale Ale

Small \$7.5 | Large \$9

ADELAIDE, AUSTRALIA

4.5%

This fantastic pale ale packs only a moderate alcohol punch but is bursting with flavour. It combines notes of orange, apple, vanilla and hop bitterness to produce a thoroughly quenching ale.

Coopers Sparkling Ale

Small \$7.5 | Large \$9

ADELAIDE, AUSTRALIA

5.8%

This beer was first made in the 1850s by Thomas Cooper. He made it from an old family recipe to cure his wife's illness. The Sparkling Ale is a cloudy golden beer with a full nose of apples and bananas and a robust body chased by a quenching dry finish.

Coopers Best Extra Stout

Small \$8 | Large \$10

ADELAIDE, AUSTRALIA

6.3%

A conveniently unverifiable legend contends that this beer is recommended by blood banks in Australia because of its high iron content. However, what we can verify is that the Best Extra Stout throws a dry, roasty and earthy nose with hints of iced coffee, toast and cream. It is a dry, dark and delicious brew.

Croucher Pale Ale

Small \$7.5 | Large \$9

ROTORUA, NEW ZEALAND

5%

Former university lecturer Paul Croucher has created a burnished golden ale which throws a punchy nose of hops and tropical fruit. It has a full, biscuity body with pronounced orange and caramel notes. The beer finishes strongly with a lingering dry finish which leaves you immediately ready for the next taste.

Emerson's Bookbinder

Small \$7.5 | Large \$9

DUNEDIN, NEW ZEALAND

3.7%

"Booky" is a deep and flavoursome blend of four malts and two local hop varieties. Soft, sweet and full in the body, the judicious use of Saaz and Fuggles hops help create a gentle palate-cleansing bitterness. Almost certainly the best session ale made in New Zealand.

Emerson's Pilsner

Small \$7.5 | Large \$9

DUNEDIN, NEW ZEALAND

4.9%

Setting the standard for New World pilsners, this is a deliciously impressive beer. It pours a sparkling gold and throws a healthy citrus nose. In the glass, it showcases a robust body bursting with lush fruit (including orange and sometimes passionfruit) before a long dry finish with white-wine crispness.

Epic Lager

Small \$7.5 | Large \$9

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND

5.5%

From the impish creator of the multi-award winning Epic Pale Ale, Epic Lager is a tasty, quaffable beer. Pouring bright gold, this soft beer is light, crisp and refreshing with the highlight being a lingering, grassy finish from the generous hopping.

Epic Pale Ale

Small \$7.5 | Large \$9

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND

5.4%

New Zealand's original American-style Pale Ale, Epic Pale has won a slew of awards, inspired almost-countless imitators, and turned legions of people into 'hopheads'. It remains as tasty as it is (now) historically important.

Fuller's London Porter

Small \$8 | Large \$10

LONDON, ENGLAND

5.4%

Fuller's classic porter is the definitive example of the beer style which once ruled the World. Rich and rewarding, with a smooth and creamy palate, it has a full flavour of malt and chocolate.

Fuller's London Pride

Small \$8 | Large \$9.5

LONDON, ENGLAND

4.7%

England's best-selling bitter, London Pride is an absolutely classic session ale. The export version is very slightly stronger, only moderately carbonated, and travels well. It's a mild but complex brew, with gentle fruitiness and a somewhat sweet, oaky body.

Mac's Black Mac

Small \$7 | Large \$8.5

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND

4%

Brewed as a Schwarzbier, a German style of dark lager, Black Mac has a lighter body than porters or stouts but still possesses healthy quantities of those familiar toasty, roasted flavour notes.

Mac's Gold

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND

5%

A classic New Zealand pale lager, Mac's Gold combines a rather-full malt profile with gently-bitter local hops and is 'lagered' (left to condition in the cold) for a full month before bottling.

Mac's Sassy Red

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND

4.5%

A tasty and hearty session ale, 'Sassy Red' is crafted with generous doses of flavourful Saaz hops and rich, distinctly red malts -- hence the name.

Mata Brown-Boy

KAWERAU, NEW ZEALAND

5%

This genuinely-local take on an amber ale uses the indigenous New Zealand pepper Horopito to add an unexpected and unique edge of flavour to a body made from a blend of four different malt varieties.

KAWERAU, NEW ZEALAND | 5%

Ask at the bar for which seasonal beer we have here.

Matilda Bay Fat Yak Small \$7.5 | Large \$9

FREMANTLE, AUSTRALIA | 5%

The first of hopefully-many beers to cross the Tasman from Aussie giant C.U.B.'s craft-brewing arm, 'Fat Yak' is an excellent introduction to the stronger, citrusy flavours of an American-style Pale Ale.

Moa Five Hop Small \$8 | Large \$9.5

BLENHEIM, NEW ZEALAND | 5.2%

This was the first ale produced by the Moa Brewery and (despite the name) is a full, malty and balanced brew with flavours of toffee, caramel and orange. It's a serious beer, essentially a delicious rare local example of an Extra Special Bitter.

Monteith's Crushed Apple Cider Small \$7 | Large \$8.5

NELSON, NEW ZEALAND | 4.5%

Cider really is becoming ubiquitous in the local market, taking its place alongside beer and wine. Monteith's were in the cider game relatively early and definitely helped win over new drinkers with this fresh-tasting offering that nicely balances the sweet and tart ends of the flavour spectrum.

Monteith's Golden Lager Small \$6.5 | Large \$8

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND | 5%

Clear and golden with a dense, white head that leaves some laces. Lightly sweet aroma of malt and brewing cereal. Medium body with a refreshingly clean finish. A classic Kiwi lager -- just with a bit more body.

Monteith's Original Ale

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND

4%

This beer is where the Monteith's story all began. Surprisingly dark and pleasantly complex, this well-balanced beer has a good malt body and a subtle hop bitterness at the end.

Renaissance Perfection Pale Ale

Small \$7.5 | Large \$9

BLENHEIM, NEW ZEALAND

5%

One of the founding beers from this decorated Blenheim craft brewery, Perfection has a full body, strong flavours and is backed up by plenty of hops. The nose is punchy and slightly spicy, while the beer itself is creamy with notes of biscuit and toffee.

Renaissance Stonecutter Scotch Ale

Small \$8 | Stem \$9 | Large \$10

BLENHEIM, NEW ZEALAND

7%

Made from an amazing grist of nine different malts, Renaissance's Scotch ale is a rich and very dark beer, looking almost like a familiar black ale but with none of the usual bitterness. The body is full and resplendent with hints of stonefruit, molasses, Christmas cake, toffee, chocolate and liquorice. Overall, a sumptuous beer.

Three Boys I.P.A.

Small \$8 | Large \$9.5

CHRISTCHURCH, NEW ZEALAND

5.2%

A distinctly New Zealand spin on British and American Pale Ales, this beer is made with very cleverly-chosen quality hops, making it full-flavoured with a tasty grapefruit character before a dry finish.

Tuatara A.P.A.

Small \$7.5 | Large \$9

REIKORANGI, NEW ZEALAND

5.8%

Tuatara celebrated an expansion to the brewery early last year by brewing a 'Limited Release' American Pale Ale that has proven so popular it's been continuously-available since. Their hoppiest offering by a long margin, it uses local and imported hops to capture the classic, intensely citrusy and aromatic character of a good A.P.A..

Tuatara Ardennes

Stem \$9

REIKORANGI, NEW ZEALAND

6.5%

The 'Ardennes' is an appropriately robust and boisterous beverage based on the classic Belgian strong golden ale style. It is powerful and flavoursome but also nicely balanced with orange and spicy notes in the glass before a complex, fruity finish rounds out this fine brew.

Tuatara Hefe

Stem \$8 | 500ml \$10

REIKORANGI, NEW ZEALAND

5%

Tuatara Hefe will certainly shake up your beer preconceptions. This German-style cloudy wheat beer may challenge some with its flavours of banana, juicyfruit gum, vanilla and spicy cloves but there are few beers more refreshing.

Tuatara Helles

Small \$7 | Large \$8.5

REIKORANGI, NEW ZEALAND

5%

This beer is descended from a traditional German style of lager famed for its drinkability and balance. Light gold in colour, Helles has a touch of noble hop aroma while in the glass there is a decent burst of early malt sweetness balanced by a late, crisp finish.

Tuatara I.P.A.

Small \$7 | Large \$8.5

REIKORANGI, NEW ZEALAND

5%

This Indian Pale Ale showcases the popular style of strong, hoppy beer that found favour (and its modern name) when it proved itself capable of surviving the long sea voyage to British colonists and soldiers in India. Full in the mouth, there is tropical fruitiness before an imperial bitter finish.

Tuatara Pilsner

Small \$7 | Large \$8.5

REIKORANGI, NEW ZEALAND

5%

The flagship beer from Wellington's most-local microbrewery, Tuatara Pilsner has a floral, grassy nose followed by a smooth malty middle with some late citrus tingles. A long, dry finish with touches of lime makes this an effortlessly balanced and most drinkable drop.

Tuatara Porter

Small \$7 | Large \$8.5

REIKORANGI, NEW ZEALAND

5%

Pouring almost black with an espresso head, Tuatara's porter has a rich, dark and peaty nose. The beer is slightly creamy with lashings of malt sweetness, chocolate and burnt Vogel's toast notes. It closes with a short, sharp finish.

Yeastie Boys Pot Kettle Black

Small \$8 | Large \$9.5

INVERCARGILL, NEW ZEALAND

6%

The 'breakout single' for the Yeastie Boys was 'PKB', the seemingly-contradictory 'Black IPA'. Abnormally-hoppy dark ales are an emerging trend in craft brewing, and PKB was right at the forefront, winning awards and winning over legions of fans.

Amstel Light

\$7

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND

2.5%

330ML

Reduced in weight through a special filtration process that gradually removes alcohol molecules, Amstel Light nonetheless retains the flavour of its heavier brother.

Asahi

THAILAND

330ML

Founded way back in 1889, Asahi were somewhat surprised at the runaway success of "Super Dry", a variety they introduced in 1987. It rescued the company from hard times, shot them to the number one rank in their home country of Japan, and launched them onto the global stage -- they now brew in several locations, to keep pace with demand.

Beck's

SYDNEY, AUSTRALIA

5%

330ML

This popular golden beer has a fresh, green bouquet, a sweet middle and a dry, clean finish. Beck's also has a slight touch of fruitiness which sets it apart from other beers of a similar style which tend to stay more dry.

BOTTLES - LAGER

Budvar \$8.5

CZECH REPUBLIC	5%	330ML
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One of the world's most famous beers, Budvar has been regarded as a classic since it was first made in 1895. A golden beer with pure white foam, Budvar has the requisite dry grassy hop aroma, the firm biscuity body with floral hints and a subtle but strong finish. Exceptionally well made.

Corona \$8.5

MEXICO	4.6%	330ML
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A famously refreshing pale lager from a country where the climate generates a pressing need for such things, Corona is popular the world over for its thirst-quenching simplicity. The origins of its associated "wedge of lime in the neck" ritual are obscure and hotly disputed; feel free to join the debate, switch instead to lemon, or skip it entirely.

Dux de Lux Ginger Tom \$12

CHURCHCHURCH, NEW ZEALAND	4%	500ML
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This full-strength "ginger beer" (an infused lager, in fact) works equally well as a summer quencher or a spicy winter warmer. Brewed in the old-fashioned style, Ginger Tom is spicy with a strong, dry ginger bite balanced by a hint of lemon and honey.

Emerson's Pilsner \$12

DUNEDIN, NEW ZEALAND	4.9%	500ML
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Setting the standard for New World pilsners, this is a deliciously impressive beer. It pours a sparkling gold and throws a healthy citrus nose. In the glass, it showcases a robust body bursting with lush fruit (including orange and sometimes passionfruit) before a long dry finish with white-wine crispness.

Heineken \$8.5

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND	5%	330ML
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This popular lager is enjoyed all around the world for its crisp, dry taste and soft, bitter finish. Its success has led to it being brewed all around the world, too, with massive quantities prepared locally in anticipation of the Rugby World Cup.

BOTTLES - LAGER

Kronenbourg 1664 \$8

SYDNEY, AUSTRALIA	5.5%	330ML
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'1664' is the most popular lager brand in France and named for the year the brewery was founded -- although it's only been known as "Kronenbourg" since the Second World War and was the "Hatt Brewery" until 1922. Now brewed in a few locations around the world, '1664' uses the distinctly-French Strisselspalt hop and is a well-rounded, refreshing beer.

Mac's Black Mac \$8

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND	4%	330ML
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Brewed as a Schwarzbier, a German style of dark lager, Black Mac has a lighter body than porters or stouts but still possesses healthy quantities of those familiar toasty, roasted flavour notes.

Mac's Light \$7

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND	1%	330ML
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The lowest-strength of New Zealand's current crop of reduced-alcohol beers, Mac's Light retains a surprising level of flavour and drinkability given its minimal one-percent weight.

Monteith's Celtic \$7.5

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND	4.4%	330ML
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This beer is designed by the brewers at Monteith's to taste like one of the rich red, malty Irish ales so popular in the Emerald Isle. They have produced a smooth, creamy beer which marries a smoky chocolate body with a firm hop finish. This delicate balance is the Celtic's highlight.

Moa Methode \$12

BLLENHEIM, NEW ZEALAND	5.5%	375ML
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This 'very rare beer' was created by Josh Scott, son of winemaker Alan Scott. The brewing process uses winemaking techniques to produce a finely bubbled beer with floral, fruity, spicy nose. It tastes of orange and honey with a long lingering finish.

BOTTLES - LAGER

Moa Noir \$12

BLenheim, NEW ZEALAND	5.5%	375ML
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Moa Noir is the original dark bird of the family. Its dark toffee pallor makes the whizzing bubbles harder to see but you can still feel them on your tongue. The Moa Noir abounds with roast coffee, chocolate, cocoa, honey and toffee notes before a bitter chocolate end.

Monteith's Original Ale \$7.5

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND	4%	330ML
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This beer is where the Monteith's story all began. Surprisingly dark and pleasantly complex, this well-balanced beer has a good malt body and a subtle hop bitterness at the end.

Monteith's Single Source \$8.5

TIMARU, NEW ZEALAND	5%	330ML
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Taking hops from one grower in Motueka, barley from a single farm in Rakaia and pure artesian water from the Canterbury Plains, Monteith's created a smooth, bright golden lager with a unique origin story.

Pure Blonde \$8

MELBOURNE, AUSTRALIA	4.6%	330ML
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Low-carb beers are an increasingly common sight and consumer choice. This version from Carlton and United Breweries is a popular Australian offering for those counting the carbs. Pure Blonde is a clean smooth beer which is very light.

Sol \$8.5

MEXICO	4%	330ML
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Brewed since 1899, Sol is rapidly emerging as a major competitor to Corona. It has a slightly grassy hop finish and a touch of honey sweetness in the middle. Best drunk cold.

BOTTLES - LAGER

Steinlager Edge \$8

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND	3.5%	330ML
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Midstrength lagers are rare indeed in the New Zealand market, but beers like this provide a useful middle-ground between full-weight brews and those officially categorised as "light". "Edge" definitely bears the hallmarks of its Steinlager heritage, and its more-moderate strength comes in handy when pacing yourself through a business lunch or a night out with friends.

Steinlager Pure \$8.5

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND	5%	330ML
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A 21st Century retooling of an iconic Kiwi brand, Steinlager 'Pure' is made with all-natural, all-local ingredients. Smoother and softer than its classic 'Green' brother, 'Pure' is a soft, dry lager which has quickly carved out its own niche.

Stella Artois \$8.5

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND	5%	330ML
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Despite Belgium's (well deserved) fame for its rich and serious abbey ales, Stella Artois still accounts for three-quarters of the nation's beer production. On top of that, it's also brewed in several locations around the world including right here in New Zealand -- such is the level of demand for this iconic brand.

Three Boys Pils \$12

CHRISTCHURCH, NEW ZEALAND	5.5%	500ML
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If you have ever wondered what a perfectly balanced lager tastes like, try this true Czech style pilsner made without any crazy ingredients. It's just a complex blend of local malt and four varieties of hops to produce a simply great beer.

BOTTLES - ALES

Coopers Sparkling Ale \$8

ADELAIDE, AUSTRALIA	5.8%	375ML
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This beer was first made in the 1850s by Thomas Cooper. He made it from an old family recipe to cure his wife's illness. The Sparkling Ale is a cloudy golden beer with a full nose of apples and bananas and a robust body chased by a quenching dry finish.

Emerson's 1812 I.P.A. \$12

DUNEDIN, NEW ZEALAND	4.9%	500ML
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This was the first New Zealand craft beer to shoot to international prominence when it was named as one of the world's top 500 beers. The full, rounded, juicy malt body has orange, caramel and nut flavours. The 1812 has a strong finish and is overall a marvellous beverage.

Guinness \$10

DUBLIN, IRELAND	4.2%	440ML
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It's unlikely there is anyone who is unaware of the almost mystical aura of Guinness even if they have never had a drop of the Black Gold. Producing a nose of bitter roasted malt, Guinness is creamy and satisfying with an astringent finish.

Little Creatures Pale Ale \$9.5

FREMANTLE, AUSTRALIA	5.2%	330ML
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The Little Creatures brewery is located in a former crocodile farm in Fremantle, WA. The use of whole American hop flowers takes this beer to new levels of aroma, flavour and bitterness. Pouring slightly cloudy because of the "little creatures" (i.e., the yeast) left in the bottle, this is a seriously tasty drop with lashings of hop, pine, citrus, grapefruit and lychee notes before a rousing bitter finish.

Moa Five Hop \$12

BLENHEIM, NEW ZEALAND	6.2%	375ML
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This was the first ale produced by the Moa Brewery and (despite the name) is a full, malty and balanced brew with flavours of toffee, caramel and orange. It's a serious beer, essentially a delicious rare local example of an Extra Special Bitter.

BOTTLES - ALES

Renaissance Discovery American Pale Ale \$13

BLENHEIM, NEW ZEALAND	4.5%	500ML
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Originally created as a special release, Discovery proved so popular it has joined the excellent range from Renaissance Brewing in Blenheim. The best American Pale Ales tend to showcase big, bold hops. This is certainly the case with Discovery which uses Willamette and Cascade hops to produce a full-bodied dark golden ale with a lingering resinous finish.

Renaissance Elemental Porter \$13

BLENHEIM, NEW ZEALAND	6%	500ML
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One of the foundation range from Renaissance, Elemental is a delightfully robust and complex English-style porter. It pours near to jet black with a rocky, espresso head. Quite full in the mouth, this silky beer exhibits notes of dark chocolate, toast, nuts, stone fruit and vanilla along with a whiff of smoke and hint of whisky. A dry finish rounds out this fine sipping porter.

Scott's Gluten-free Pale Ale \$9.5

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND	4.5%	330ML
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This young West Auckland brewery specialises in making gluten-free beers (brewing New Zealand's first) and in 2009 won the prestigious Morton Coutts award for brewing innovation. Founder Phillip Scott is gluten-intolerant but was determined to continue to enjoy beers even if it meant brewing them himself. This Pale Ale balances some honey sweetness, tart citrus and a gentle bitterness.

Three Boys Golden Ale \$12

CHRISTCHURCH, NEW ZEALAND	4.5%	500ML
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Brewed in the modern style of an aromatic, golden, quenching ale, this beer bursts with zesty fruit notes (grapefruit, passionfruit) before a cleansing finish. The old beer nerd joke has it that Golden Ale is "Thinking Man's Lager", and it's not far wrong. This is summer in a glass.



BEER

BOTTLES - BELGIAN ALES

Chimay Blue \$14

BELGIUM	9%	330ML
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This is one of the most famous beers in the world. It is a rich dark beer with an aromatic and lively nose of yeast, flowers, honey, malt and spices. In the mouth there is fruit (redcurrant) and spices (thyme, pepper, nutmeg) dancing along the lively bubbles. This beer becomes more like a port as it ages and a selection of vintages are usually available.

Chimay Red \$12

BELGIUM	7%	330ML
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Brewed by Trappist monks, the Chimay beers enjoy a deserved reputation for outstanding quality. The flavours here are a startling mix of silky sweetness, raisins, currants and spice before a luxurious finish. As a sign near a Belgian monastery asks: "The good Lord has changed water into wine, so how can drinking beer be a sin?"

Chimay White \$13

BELGIUM	8%	330ML
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Like all Trappist beers, the Chimay White is not pasteurised and is refermented in the bottle. This helps it age and over time it will become drier. The White is a lighter beer with a dry, yeasty, hoppy nose. It is fruity (oranges and juniper) and spicy with a dry, peppery finish.

Duvel \$12.5

BELGIUM	8.5%	330ML
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After tasting the first experimental batch, someone in the brewery remarked that it was 'a devil of a beer' hence the Flemish corruption, Duvel. Enormously complex to make, it pours with a massive head and throws a strong nose. It has flavours of orange zest, pear brandy and green apples before a long dry finish.

Lefte Blonde \$10

BELGIUM	6.6%	330ML
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This clear, golden beer has a soft, fruity, orange nose with a smooth body highlighted by little touches of yeast and spice. Lefte Blonde is excellent place to start for those wanting to explore the world of Belgian beer.

BOTTLES - BELGIAN ALES

Lefte Brune **\$10**

BELGIUM	6.5%	330ML
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As the name would suggest, Lefte Brune is the darker counterpart to Lefte Blonde. It makes for an interesting contrast, with the much more roasted and darker malts producing quite a different beer. It is softly sweet with hints of rich fruit and nuts before a gentle finish.

Orval **\$12**

BELGIUM	6.2%	330ML
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The only commercial beer produced by this monastic brewery, Orval has a unique fruity and acidic nose with a hint of horseblanket thanks to the monks' very careful and practiced use of the usually-wild yeast *Brettanomyces*. It is complex, piquant and peppery before a long bitter finish.

BOTTLES - WHEAT BEER

Moa Blanc **\$12**

BLLENHEIM, NEWZEALAND	5.5%	375ML
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Blanc is another interesting offering from the innovative Moa brewery in Blenheim. This pale yellow beer shows off the streams of tiny yet strong bubbles to perfection is overall fruity, spicy and very effervescent.

Three Boys Wheat **\$12**

CHRISTCHURCH, NEWZEALAND	5%	500ML
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This is an interesting twist on the popular Belgian style wheat beer. Instead of the usual orange peel they use lemon zest even though zesting buckets of lemons is their least favourite part of brewing. The result is a refreshing nose of citrus and coriander culminating in a creamy, spicy beer with a sour citrus snap and a long spicy finish.

Bulmers Apple Cider \$10

GISBORNE, NEW ZEALAND	4.6%	500ML
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Bulmers has been making cider for over 120 years and is now being produced under licence here, in sunny Gisborne. It has a reddish tinge in the glass, is full-bodied and sits at the slightly sweeter end of the scale.

Bulmers Pear Cider \$10

GISBORNE, NEW ZEALAND	4.6%	500ML
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After apple cider finally broke through into the modern drinker's consciousness, pear cider might just be the Next Next Big Thing. Bulmers have drawn on their considerably cider-making experience and released this light-and-easy offering.

Crooked Cider \$12.5

There are no additives beyond those two fundamental ingredients, and the authenticity of flavour that results is obvious.
